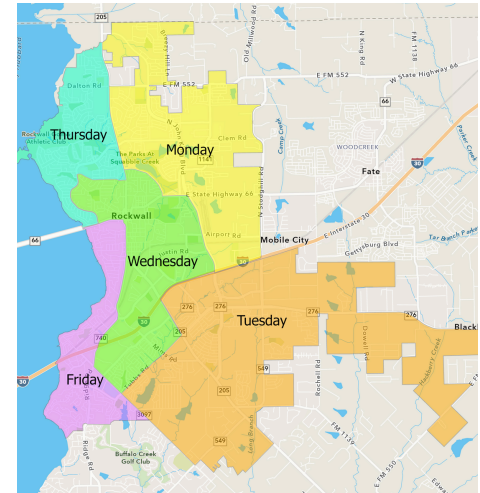


CHANGES TO GARBAGE, RECYCLING, BRUSH, AND BULK COLLECTION

Changes to garbage, recycling, brush, and bulk services are now in effect. As a reminder, www.rockwall.com, City social media channels, email updates, and direct mailers have additional information for residents to review.

Effective January 12, 2026

- All residents should check the new schedule map to see their new collection day
- Garbage and recycling will be collected **one time** per week
- Only Republic Services supplied carts will be emptied. Garbage: blue cart with black lid. Recycling: blue cart with light blue lid
- Garbage and recycling carts must be out by 7:00 a.m. of your collection day
- Carts should be 3 feet apart and away from other objects and each other
- All materials must fit inside the cart with the lid fully closed
- If you have old rental Republic Services carts, small recycling bins, or personal garbage cans that you no longer want, place them in your bulk pile (in front of your home, not in the alley) during your designated bulk week and make sure they are labeled "trash"

TEMPORARY CHANGE IN WATER DISINFECTANT

The North Texas Municipal Water District (NTMWD) will implement its annual temporary change in water disinfectant beginning in March for approximately one month. This routine maintenance ensures water quality and safety by using chlorine-only disinfection during this period. Residents may notice a slight change in taste or smell, but the water remains safe to drink and use. The process, required by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality, includes ongoing testing to meet safety standards. Certain groups, such as dialysis patients, aquatic animal owners, etc., may consider taking necessary precautions. INTERSTATE 30 UPDATES

TxDOT's ongoing construction projects in Rockwall continue to bring major roadway improvements. Along the eastbound frontage road at the lake, crews are working on bridge decks and will soon begin constructing the approaches and railings. On the westbound side, crews have completed the drill shafts and columns in the lake and are now moving forward with substructure work and preparing for deck pours.

At Horizon Road, bridge beams for the next phase of construction are scheduled to be set soon. At Ridge Road, crews are building retaining walls and extending the substructure to support the bridge widening. Over on John King Blvd, crews have been prepping for deck pour.

TRAVIS' TOOLBOX

February is the ideal time to prepare your landscape and equipment for the busy spring season ahead. Start by sharpening or replacing your mower blades and giving your mower some care with an oil change and a new air filter. Inspect your irrigation system thoroughly and make any needed repairs to ensure everything is in top shape when watering season arrives.

Before March 1st, focus on pruning your trees, cutting back ornamental grasses and perennial plants, and planting new trees and shrubs. Mid to late February is also the perfect time to apply a pre-emergent herbicide to prevent spring and summer weeds from taking over.

Remember that many common projects such as adding a deck, fence, roof replacement, accessory buildings, or other structural or mechanical changes, require a permit to ensure safety and compliance with city codes. Applying for the appropriate permit helps protect your investment and keeps our community safe.
